Are You a Missionary? Am I?

One of the guests at the LWML convention in Lexington was Gary Thies, the Mission Development Counselor for the LCMS. He was also a guest at our Ohio district convention in 2000. His question to each of us, during his presentation and in his conversations with individuals, both this year and in the year 2000, was, "Are you a missionary?"



He was disappointed that so many of us said, "No," in answer to his question.

Should we have said, "Yes?" After all, our name is the Lutheran Women's Missionary League; we are also called Lutheran Women in Mission. The League mission statement includes the phrase "we joyfully proclaim Christ."

Do you take the titles and the mission statement to heart? Do I?

As I ask myself that question, I begin to defend myself by saying that over the past few years I have become more consistent in spending time every day in the Word and in prayer. I have a mites contribution deducted from my bank account every month. But do those activities make me a missionary?

Here are some of the admonitions to read in the Word:





downtown Toledo. This congregation reaches out to their local community with physical needs as well as spiritual needs. May God bless these recipients!





LWML Ohio District Convention Zone Banner Instructions



For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and to the eater (Isaiah 55:10).

List the theme, convention year, and the Bible reference – do not duplicate the convention logo.


BANNER SIZE: 58 inches long, by 32 inches wide maximum. Size may be determined on how it might be used by your zone after convention, i.e. baby quilt, lap robe, wall hanging, or church banner.

- 1. The theme of the convention is "Lord of the Harvest," (Isaiah 55:10)
- 2. The logo of the convention is noted on this sheet. The colors of the convention are blue, green and gold.
- 3. Convention logo is NOT to be used on your zone banner. It will be exclusively displayed on the convention banner (presented by the host committee).
- 4. Banner designers are encouraged to use their artistic talent and creativity in designing their banner with the convention theme in mind.
- 5. The banner will be hung on a stand after procession of zone presidents at the Friday worship service and will be on display during the convention. A member of the zone must take the banner on Saturday at the close of convention.
- 6. Do not reference LWML on the front of the banner.
- 7. Do identify your banner with your zone president's name and phone number on the back of it, either in permanent marker or a detachable card.
- 8. Use non-bleeding materials on your banner for laundry purposes.

From previous conventions, here are some useful tips:

Finishing and hanging instructions:

A. Using the top hem of your banner, place a 1" dowel rod through top hem of banner so it hangs like a curtain. Use taut cords tied through eyelets at the end of the dowel. Or you may use clip-on cafe curtain rings to attach the banner to the dowel. A cord must be hung from the ends of the dowel in order to hang the banner from the pole. Only use a 1" dowel - not a curtain rod.



- B. Place a loop in the center of the cord to hang the banner on the pole to keep it centered.
- C. Sew two ties on the center back near the bottom using 14" ribbon long enough to tie a bow on a 2" pole. (If desired, this can be basted to easily remove it after convention.)
- D. Also sew two ties on the center back near the top using 14" ribbon long enough to tie a bow on a 2" pole. (If desired, this can be basted to easily remove it after convention.)
