Anticipation and Concern

I want to share with you my anticipation of our upcoming convention in June. Our theme is Psalm 28:7a, The Lord is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts, and I



am helped. My study Bible points out that strength represents offensive power, the shield represents defensive power, and God blesses all his people as he blessed David.

Our Bible study leader will be Dr. Timothy Saleska, a professor at Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis. He has written a commentary on the Psalms and served two Ohio congregations. One of his former members assured me that, "He was the most effective Bible study leader we have ever had!"

Our keynote speaker will be the Rev. Kristopher Whitby, from the Northern Illinois District. He was an LWML counselor a few years ago. I heard him lead a Bible study one morning at the convention in Milwaukee. You won't want to miss his presentation!

We have a mission speaker, Rev. Dr. Matthew Heise with the Lutheran Heritage Foundation. LHF received one of our mission grants this past biennium. He is looking forward to thanking us for the support and updating us on the production of the Bible meant for teens.

Rev. Ryan Kleimola, our District Pastoral Counselor, will speak to us at the worship service on Friday evening.

Details: The convention will be June 21-22 at the Holiday Inn in Canton, Ohio. We have kept the registration fee as low as we could. The hotel offers a reduced rate for LWML members who stay on Thursday, Friday and/or Saturday nights. Servant events begin at 10 a.m. on Friday and the convention itself opens at 1:00 p.m.

I have invited excellent speakers, the hotel is a beautiful facility, and the host committee is working hard to ensure all will run smoothly. Each church in our district can have two voting delegates. So, plan to come with a friend for a wonderful LWML experience!

Reminder

We passed a budget in June, 2022 of \$190,000. As of December 2023, our receipts totaled \$134,842. That leaves us with just over \$55,000 behind. Our fiscal period ends March 31.

It should be noted that our mission grants have all been fully paid. But the shortfall affects publications and meeting expenses.

Most of us know we have fewer group meetings, which is where many contributions originate. So we need to be more intentional about our support. Here are some suggestions:

- ♦ Have a quarterly or monthly mite offering during or after worship services. Remind people of the mission grant recipients.
- ▶ Budget an offering monthly and set up automatic charges to your credit card or withdrawals from your bank account. Financial Secretary Janet Pauley can help. Her contact information is on the back page of this edition.
- ▼ Have a pledge walk for mites at a nearby park to celebrate spring's first day.
- ♥ Plan a bake sale or a pizza sale for a day when there is a big athletic event in your area.

You will have better ideas of your own. But please remind your members of LWML's good work and encourage their support.

Thank you for all you do, for the Lord, and for the LWML. I will close with a Bible verse from a coffee mug I received for Christmas: "Let all that you do be done in love" 1 Cor. 16:14.

Letters from Christ

Timothy Keller shares an intercontinental exchange from the 1960's that can help us realize God's work in our lives and others' lives. Keller tells of Russian Cosmonaut, Yuri Gagarin, the first man in space in 1961. A few months after Garagin's pioneering space flight, the Premier of the Soviet Union, Nakita Khrushchev, in support of atheism, observed about the flight, "Gagarin flew into space, but didn't see any god there."

To Krushchev, as an atheist this was confirmation of his views, comfort for his misguided conscience, and a healthy dollop of snarky shade thrown at Christian followers. C. S. Lewis was a contemporary of Cosmonaut Gagarin. In response to this quip from Krushchev, C. S. Lewis wrote, "If there is a God who created the world and created us, I could no more 'meet' Him than Hamlet could meet Shakespeare. If Hamlet wants to prove there is Shakespeare, he's not going to be able to do it in a lab, nor is he likely to find Shakespeare by going up to the top of the stage. The only way he will know something about Shakespeare is if Shakespeare writes something about himself into the play."

We have passed Christmas where the joy of the incarnation is brought front and center to our minds. We recall the Word made flesh dwelling among us and this is the good news we have and can share with the world. As we approach warmer days and the rest of the Church year ahead of us, it is monumentally imperative that we continue to meditate on the reality that God reveals Himself to us.

At the same time we get the opportunity to reveal Him to others. Paul's words in Romans 10 are so often reserved for pastors: How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? Perhaps rightly so on some levels as it talks about preaching and sending. However, there is a reality that we all have an opportunity to tell people about Jesus. This is so they can hear how He has become a part of our story. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 3:2-3 tie this all together in my mind as he says: You yourselves are our letter of recommendation, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all. And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

Each of us carries the peace that passes all understanding in our hearts as we go forth in our lives in the name of Christ. This peace needs to be shared for people to know about. We will never understand it, but we, for the sake of the world around us, can live from it. My prayer for the LWML ladies and for all of our sisters and brothers in Christ is that we would continue to know God has written Christ into our story and he places us into others' lives so we can share that Good News with the world that needs to be

changed by it.

May God bless you as you dwell in Him and bring Him to others. Looking forward to seeing you at the convention!

LWML Ohio District Convention Banner Instructions

Each zone is encouraged to bring a banner to the convention. It should have a design which illustrates our theme: The Lord is My Strength and My Shield. This is based on Psalm 28:7a, The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me.

Here are some details:

- † The finished banner size should be 3' x 5'.
- † You may not use the convention logo on your banner, but please try to find a design which reflects our theme.
- † You can use your choice of colors.
- † Please do not use heavy or bulky fabrics, as the banner should be easy to manage when carried.
- † Your zone's name should be on the front of the banner, abbreviated, if necessary. Also indicate your zone name on the lower left corner on the back side of the banner.
- † Attach two ties to the back of the banner. One tie should be at the center of the banner width, about 10"-12" from the top. The other tie should be at the center of the banner width, about 10"-12" from the bottom. These ties should be long enough to tie a bow around a 2" pole. Please stitch the ties to the back, and avoid using Velcro for them, as it has proved ineffective.
- † At the top, attach the banner to a 1" dowel with an eye screw on each end of the dowel. Use a strong ¼" or larger-diameter cord. Make a small loop at the center for hanging. Secure the cording through each eye screw. Knot the cord on the outside of each screw.

We understand that it is becoming difficult to find people who enjoy making banners. If necessary, you may choose to use a banner your zone has brought to a previous convention, or you may make a banner to represent your zone that you might want to use again in the future, with a general LWML theme. It is also acceptable to have the banner professionally printed on vinyl.


We closed with zone announcements and a beautiful photo of the group with their crosses. It was an amazing event!
