Spring is coming! That's one thing we can be certain about for 2021.

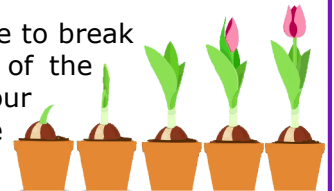

Don't forget how God has been your strength and stay through the dark and dreary days of 2020. Keep

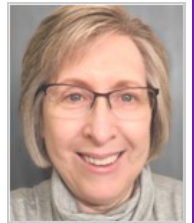

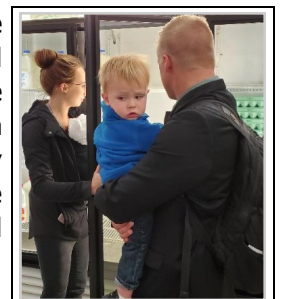

Flatten the Curve...NEVER!

As Lutheran Women in Mission, we must never, ever work to flatten the curve of the spread of God's love and grace! Since June 2020, the LWML Ohio District has sent the initial mission grant payments to seven, yes seven of our 10 grant recipients.



Grant #2-is designated for the Support of Full-Time Students Preparing for Church Work: We have received notes of gratitude from seven students preparing for work as Deaconesses, Teachers, Directors of Christian Education, Directors of Christian Outreach, Directors of Family Life and Youth Ministry, and Parish Workers. All recipients expressed excitement about their current studies and future service opportunities. One letter summed up the sentiments from all of the notes and letters. "I hope and pray that the LWML will continue to support future church workers studying at the Concordia Universities and Seminaries."

Grant #3-Concordia Seminary Fort Wayne, IN, Food (& Clothing) Co-Op: It served 75 families with no-contact/drive-through food pantry service for 12 weeks earlier this year. It is currently reopened for in person shopping, feeding 375 people (students, spouses, and children). This is all at no cost to the students as our mighty mites help with the purchase of goods distributed to them. Students earn credit for food and clothing by volunteering each quarter.

Grant #4-Placing a Missionary Couple to Proclaim Christ to Muslim Immigrants in Central Ohio (partnering with POBLO): Missionaries Joseph Beshai and Heba Mardook and their two sons have been placed at St. John, Dublin, Ohio, and have been making a difference in the lives of many. Food pantries, clothing banks, international cooking classes, and English as a Second Language classes all bring immigrants into the circle of Joseph and Heba, allowing them to share the love of Jesus. By God's grace, in December, an Iraqi Muslim woman was baptized. Soon, her husband and son will also be baptized.

Grant #6-Ohio Division Orphan Grain Train: The grant money will be used for transportation costs. In July 2020 the Ohio Division of Orphan Grain Train made several deliveries of goods to local missions and churches that assist those in need.

Grant #7-Bringing Light to those Living in Darkness (Lutheran Braille Workers LBW): The \$3,000 already received has been a tremendous

blessing for the two Ministry Production Centers we have located in Ohio. The centers purchased the paper, bindings, and boxes required to produce hundreds of volumes of the Bible in Braille. Our two Ministry Production Centers in Ohio produced 1,014 books of the Bible in Braille in English, Spanish, and Kiswahili. which were sent throughout the United States and the world!

Grant #9-Worship Anew Sharing God's Word Through TV (grant money to expand TV markets in the Ohio District): Even through the COVID19 quarantines, Worship Anew continued their 30-minute broadcasts of Lutheran worship in the six Ohio television markets in Cleveland, Lima, Sandusky, Toledo, Van Wert, Youngstown, and in the north western portion of Ohio via the Fort Wayne television market. Worship Anew is also accessible through their website www.WorshipAnew.org at any time.

Please continue to keep all of these projects in your prayers as you drop coins and quiet money into your Mite Boxes. Let's work to increase the curve of the spread of God's Word and the infectious love of Jesus.

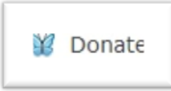

What's New on the Web

Donate Button

There is a new (and easy) way to support the mission work of the LWML Ohio District. Our website, www.lwmlohio.org



has a donate button. Click the button and you will be taken to the Vanco site. Vanco is a faith-based secure provider of online giving

and donations. Through Vanco you are able to make a one-time or an ongoing donation.

At the Vanco site, you are given the opportunity to set up an account or to continue as a guest. Mite donations are listed as "Mites Joyful Response". Honors and Memorials may be made. When listing the person's name, designate if you are giving as an honor or as a

memorial. *Quarterly* and *ODE* payments may also be paid. It is important that you list your zone and church.

Once you have listed your donation information, click the continue button. This gives a summary of the information that will be sent to Janet Pauley, the Financial Secretary for the LWML Ohio District. After you have checked the accuracy of your donation, you will be asked to provide the bank routing number of your financial institution and your account number as shown on the bottom of your check, or you can make a payment via credit card. You will click the "I am not a robot" button and then click submit. A receipt will be provided to you to print for your records. It is as simple as that!

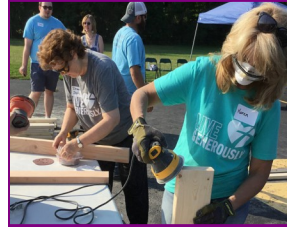

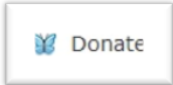

Seminary Gift Cards

The LWML of Trinity Lutheran, Toledo, continued their annual mission service project of gift cards for Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana. The cards are distributed through the seminary's Food and Clothing Coop to all students at CTS prior to Christmas. This year, because of the virus, the process was handled differently. We utilized Trinity Lutheran School's Scrip program and all gift card purchases were handled by the school secretary rather than having the cards purchased at local stores by individuals.



A special envelope was inserted into Trinity's bulletin during the first two weeks of November. Using the designated envelopes, our members contributed \$2,445 for gift cards! What a wonderful outpouring of love given to the families of our future pastors and deaconesses!

The beds are made of wood and the day of a "build" volunteers cut, sand, drill, stain, brand with the SHP logo on the headboard, and partially assemble the bed with completed assembly in the recipient's home.
