The LWML Canada president and a representative from Brazil's equivalent to LWML were also present for this convention. The diversity of people present really helped drive home the theme and made for an inspiring worship service. In addition to meeting people from other countries, it was also a blessing to bump into old friends, be it from former congregations or former conventions. The hosts of "The Lutheran Ladies Lounge" podcast provided the Saturday night entertainment which was both informative and hilarious as LWMLers and the LLL hosts faced off in a "Family Feud" style game for a portion of the show. This time of work, worship, and fellowship was truly one for the books.

That was the theme, based on Psalm 33, of the 40th biennial convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, aka Lutheran Women in Mission. And what a celebration it was!

Over 3,550 attendees and a choir of over 300 members gathered to worship, Bible study and fellowship in Milwaukee Wisconsin on June 22-25, 2023. Volunteers came from Northern Wisconsin, Southern Wisconsin and Northern Illinois all contributing to a very effective and coordinated convention. It was amazing how efficiently communion was administered to the large number of people at the Thursday evening service (well over 3,000) thanks to the large number of Pastors who were attending, with assistance from the Young Women Representatives plus the local volunteers helping direct people. Serious sessions describing the work of missionaries and agencies focused on sharing Christ throughout the world, singing, and humorous interludes were abundant.

Impressive moments at the opening session included the "parade" of banners from the many zones from which members attended that represented the convention theme, and at a later session, the parade of flags from the many countries (69?) that have received mission grants from LWML to proclaim our Lord in many ways over many years. I am awed that we women, through our "mites", were able to fund 31 mission grants for the next 2 years to the tune of \$2,441,072.62. Never say that your coins can't make a big difference.

It was a truly joyous celebration. Praise the Lord!
