The Old Has Gone, the New Has Come

Last summer I had to have a tall, old spruce tree cut down in my yard. It had dropped needles on my lawn for the previous two years and was quickly dying. I had ground cover growing beneath it in a circle that extended to the drip line. The stump was ground up, but it left a large pile of mulch.




Old life

I'd like to convert that circle into a garden with hostas around the outside edge, but hostas don't grow well near evergreens. I need to remove the evergreen mulch, and I am doing it a little at a time. The advice I received about preparing the soil was to leave it alone for a year and to apply a high nitrogen fertilizer first.

This reminds me of the paragraph which includes 2 Corinthians 5:17, Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone; the new is here!

We are like the mulch that needs to be cleared out and the soil that needs to be treated before we can support new growth. It doesn't always happen overnight.

As I, or any person, would come to Jesus, I need to put aside my favorite sins and allow Jesus to guide me into becoming the new person he designed me to be. The old has to go before the new can come.



Paul goes on to say in verse 20 that we are ambassadors for Christ. For my garden, I will do what it takes to prepare the soil for the plants I want to plant. Similarly, in God's work, we need to introduce people to Christ and encourage their Christian growth. We can befriend them, listen to them, share the gospel, pray for them, encourage them. Try to be a good example and show them how Jesus has worked in our lives. Remember: Even though we may plant seeds and water and fertilize them, just as God gives the growth to plants, it will be the Holy Spirit who gives new Christians faith in Jesus. 




I have returned to my family and pastoral duties, including LWML.


On a March Saturday, the women of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML), Toledo Zone, met for their


made Valentine's Day cards for the residents of Luther Home, a care facility for men and women with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO LWML OHIO DISTRICT BYLAWS

If the proposed amendments are adopted at the District convention, then the Structure Committee requests permission to renumber or reletter sections to account for insertions.

Rationale for proposed amendments: to provide a way for members to attend a meeting that they cannot attend in person.

ARTICLE XII – BOARD OF DIRECTORS Section 2. subsection d

Proposed Amendment:

Replace current wording with new subsections.

Existing bylaws read:

 In case of emergency, action may be taken by mail, telephone, or electronic messaging.

If adopted will read:

- d. The President or Committee Chairman may hold meetings by teleconference or videoconference. Members must be able to see and/or hear each other.
 - 1) A quorum shall consist of a majority of the membership.
 - Voting shall be by voice vote, show of hands, or another method that allows for individual votes to be given and counted. Anything requiring a 2/3 vote necessitates a hand count.
- e. The President or Committee Chairman shall provide the agenda and date of the meeting.
- f. When a meeting is via phone, the vote can be taken and then ratified at the next in-person meeting so that discussion can take place if needed.

ARTICLE XIII – EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE Section 2, subsection a

Proposed Amendment:

Add additional wording at end of subsection.

Existing bylaws read:



- c. When a meeting is via phone, the vote can be taken and then ratified at the next inperson meeting so that discussion can take place if needed
