Our pastor spotlight for this edition is Pastor Green. He was born in Painesville, Ohio, and attended Zion Lutheran in Painesville for 35 years. Pastor Green is married to Kathy, and they have three children and seven grandchildren. Between high school graduation and enrolling at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, Pastor Green

drove a wide variety of trucks and earned an associate degree in accounting. During his third year of seminary, he served as a vicar in Carroll, Iowa. Pastor Green graduated and then in 1996 received the call to Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Parma.

What made you decide to become a pastor? Looking back, now I can see that for many years I went through the motions of going to church but had no trust in Jesus for eternal life. Then, through a new pastor at Zion, Rev. James Zinkowich, I started doing a daily Bible devotion and memorizing key Bible verses. As the months went by, the Holy Spirit finally opened my eyes to see my helplessness to save myself and re-enabled me to trust in Jesus for eternal life. As time went by, I became more grateful for God's gift of salvation and open to whatever His will might be for my life – which finally led to seminary and the pastoral ministry.

**Do you have a favorite Bible verse and why is it your favorite?** I have many favorites, but here is one: NAS **Ezra 7:10** "For Ezra had <u>set</u> his heart to <u>study</u> the law of the LORD, and to <u>practice</u> *it*, and to <u>teach</u> *His* statutes and ordinances in Israel." Note the four underlined words and their order; they are all critical for teaching. First, we go to the Bible with our heart open to hear God's word; second, we study God's word; third, we put God's word into practice in our lives; and, fourth, we are finally ready to teach God's word to others.

**Tell us a little bit about your experience in car racing.** I drag raced a little at Thompson Raceway Park after I turned 16; then, a couple years later, I got involved racing each Saturday for about five years, raced g a 67 Chevelle and a 68 Camaro, and raced at some other tracks in the area. I enjoyed it but stopped when our first child was born.

**How were you introduced to LWML?** I learned some things about LWML at my home congregation (LWML Sunday), at the seminary, and when I arrived at Bethlehem. Then, through Kathy getting involved and my Bible teaching at some events held at Bethlehem, I learned much more.

Who was your mentor growing up? If you mean a spiritual mentor, I didn't have one. I went to church, Sunday School, and Bible Class, and had people who cared about me, but, honestly, I was somewhat uninterested and uncomfortable asking questions. I continued that way for years until God used Pastor Zinkowich to make a huge difference in my life, as noted above.

Do you have any fun plans with the family this Fall? We are hoping to enjoy the fall weather, do more walking in our various metro parks, have some get-togethers with family, friends, and church members.

If you had a choice as to which sporting event you wanted to attend, which would it be? I enjoy drag racing, football, and baseball.
