Billie's Bytes

The women's Bible study group at my church has been using the studies found in the LWML Quarterly for many years. The Spring 2021 Quarterly studies (as well as most of the articles) centered around JOY and rejoicing. When we came to the final study, "Rejoice, Always", one member commented, "We sure have been talking a lot about joy!"

And it's true, we had looked at many Bible verses (sometimes, the same verse in different studies) and by the power of the Holy Spirit we were able to leave each session with "Joy, Joy, Joy – down in our hearts".

There is a huge difference between being happy and having joy. Happiness is an emotion that is dependent on situations that are always changing – happiness (or lack thereof) shows on your face and in your actions "If you're happy and you know it clap your hands...." kind of stuff. JOY on the other hand, is a gift of the Spirit. It is the smile that lives in your heart no matter what the circumstance. (You might want to read the book of Philippians to see what Paul has to say about rejoicing!) Joy is having the "peace that passes understanding" and the "love of Jesus, love of Jesus" down in your heart. Joy is present, even when the tears are flowing.

Recently I came across a Wizard of Id (by Park and Hart) comic in which the wizard begins his day with a sunrise and throughout the day there are storms and troubles – he sits staring at his computer during the havoc of the day and in the last frame he calls out, "I have seen the future and it's amazing!" Nothing is going to ruin his future! Satan wants nothing more than to steal our joy. He attacks us as he throws his arrows of poisonous lies meant to reach us in our most vulnerable state. He will use hardship, guilt, idolatry, doubt – you name it, he uses it to try to steal our joy. That is why we want to stay focused on God's Word, so that we can shout out with all surety "I have seen the future and it is amazing." Joy is living in the pure Hope that we are marked for eternity by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Joy is knowing that Christ, Who for joy (Hebrews 12:2) endured the cross, has conquered sin, death and the power of the devil. He did that so that His joy would make our joy complete (John 15:11). Rejoice! YOU ARE LOVED.


"Mitey" Mites

Ten members of the Northeast Zone along with 2,787 registered guests were blessed to be present at the 39th Biennial Convention of the LWML, held in Lexington, KY June 24-27. They represented ten of our churches. Delegates Carol Vought (Peace, Chardon) and Zone President, Billie Lelle (St. Paul's, Painesville) were given the privilege of representing the zone as we voted on Mission Grants, Amendments and Officers. Lois Cox (Grace, Thompson); Jan Swetel and Marilyn Kent (Zion, Painesville); and Jackie Rychel and Sue Matzke (St. Mark, Chesterland) were volunteers throughout the convention. Ann Marie Bollas (Zion) served as Communications Coordinator and Jeanne Schimmelmann (Bethel, Willowick) served as Guest Services Coordinator throughout the convention and spent many hours prior to the convention in preparation. Carolyn Lindenmuth (Secretary at Zion but presently a member at a PA church), went as a guest but volunteered whenever needed throughout the convention.

Delegate Carol will share her convention experience at the 2022 Spring Rally which will be held at Zion, Painesville. You will find many pictures and various links at http://lwmlohio.org.
