


Toledo Zone

Their services are free and veterans and their families receive counseling and referrals to professionals who can assist in helping them re-adjust to life back home, re-connect with each other, reintegrate into their communities and re-new their relationship with God. LMVFM uses therapy dogs as an aid in counseling veterans. Therapy dog, Lily Belle, accompanied Leslie to the rally.

We had an offering for mites and the ladies of Good Shepherd served a delicious lunch at which time we also had time for fellowship.


Central Zone



Pastors will be given priority in registration, but others may attend this sessions as space allows.



2018 LWML OHIO DISTRICT CONVENTION ZONE BANNER SPECIFICATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

Zone Banners from the zones comprising the LWML Ohio District will be made in each zone's choice of either a (1) baby blanket, (2) lap pad/robe, (3) banner, or (4) quilt. Each zone will take its own banner after the convention and can keep it, gift it, or donate it as determined by zone officers.

Specifications:

- 1. The theme of the convention is "Walk in the Light" 1 John1:7.
- 2. The logo of the convention is noted on this sheet. The logo was designed by Karen Shanahan. The colors of the convention are gold, black and red.
- 3. Please note: the convention logo is **NOT** to be used on your zone banner. It will be exclusively displayed on the convention banner (presented by the host committee from the Columbus Zone).
- 4. **Banner designers are encouraged to use their artistic talent and creativity in designing** their banner with the convention theme in mind.
- 5. For this convention, there is no specific size of the banner required. However, maximum size is 36" x 50". The banner will be hung on a banner stand after procession of zone presidents at the Friday worship service. The banners will be on display during the convention. A member of the zone must take the banner on Sunday at the close of convention.
- 6. Do **not** reference LWML on the front of the banner.
- 7. Do identify your banner with your zone president's name and phone number on the back of it, either in permanent marker or a detachable card.
- 8. Use non-bleeding materials on your banner for laundry purposes.
- 9. From previous conventions, here are some useful tips:
 - A. Using the top hem of your banner, place a 1" dowel rod through top hem of banner so it hangs like a curtain. Use taut cords tied through eyelets at the end of the dowel. Or you may use clip-on cafe curtain rings to attach the banner to the dowel. A cord **must** be hung from the ends of the dowel in order to hang the banner from the pole. Only use a 1" dowel not a curtain rod.
 - B. Place a loop in the center of the cord to hang the banner on the pole to keep it centered.
 - C. Sew two ties on the center back near the bottom using 14" ribbon long enough to tie a bow on a 2" pole. (If desired, this can be basted to easily remove it after convention.)
 - D. Also sew two ties on the center back near the top using 14" ribbon long enough to tie a bow on a 2" pole. (If desired, this can be basted to easily remove it after convention.)
